- 3. Colosse: ~100 miles from Ephesus, close to Hierapolis and Laodicea (c.f. Col. 4:13,16); [map]
- 4. Purpose: Conveys the preeminence of Christ in ALL things He is the first and foremost in everything and our life should be ordered around that fact
- 5. Parallel in many ways to Ephesians

Discussion:

I. GREETING (COL. 1:1-2)

- A. Written by: Paul, apostle of Jesus by God's will, & Timothy our bro.
- B. Written to: Saints and faithful brethren in Christ
 - 1. Two ways of referring to the same group of people
 - 2. They were Christians striving to serve God faithfully
- C. Grace and peace from: God (Father) and Christ (Lord)
 - 1. Grace the favor of God
 - 2. Peace inward calm that comes from being right with the Lord

II. THANKSGIVING (COL. 1:3-8)

- A. Paul and Timothy giving thanks and praying always for them. To the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ
 - 1. Their faith in Christ Jesus (Col. 1:4a)
 - a. It was known by others Paul/Timothy heard of it
 - b. It was a steadfast faith (Col. 2:5-7)
 - 2. Their love of all saints (Col. 1:4b)
 - a. Again it was know by others
 - b. Love should be characteristic of our life in Christ (1 Jn. 3:14, 4:7-8, 11)
 - 3. Their hope in heaven (Col. 1:5-8)
 - our hope isn't here but in heaven
 - (1 Pt. 1:3-5, 13; Heb. 6:18-20) Hope as an anchor
 - A. Which they heard in the gospel (Col. 1:5)

-The source of this hope – the gospel (Eph. 1:13; 1 Thess. 2:13)

- B. Which came to them al all the world (Col. 1:6a)
 - The gospel appeared to every creature (Mk. 16:15; Col. 1:23)
- C. Which is bringing forth fruit (Col. 1:6b)
 - God is glorified when we are fruitful (Jn. 15:2,8)
 - Occurred right away since the day you heard and knew
- D. Which was learned from Epaphras (Col. 1:7-8)
 -thanks for those who share gospel (Rom. 10:14-15; "Is. 52:7")
 -and he reported back their love. A sharing in the gospel.
- B. Are brethren thankful for us? Do they think of our faith, love, and hope?

III. PRAYER (Col. 1:9-14)

- A. Paul and Timothy give thanks, praying always. They are doing well but their earnest prayer is for them to grow and do more!
 - 1. Be filled with the knowledge of His will (Col. 1:9b)
 - Epignosis true knowledge, full discernment
 - In all wisdom and spiritual understanding (prayer Js. 1:5)
 - His will is made known to us in word (c.f. Eph. 1:9; 3:3-5)
 - 2. Walk worthy of the Lord (Col. 1:10-14)

- The goal of knowledge of His will! ("How sad to see a master of theology and a failure in living")

- A repeated plea to saints (Eph. 4:1; Phil. 1:27; 1 Thess. 2:11-12)
- A. Fully pleasing Him (Col. 1:10)
 - Not about pleasing men but God (c.f. Gal. 1:10)
- B. Fruitful in every good work (Col. 1:10)
 - they need to continue bearing fruit (c.f. Col. 1:6b)
 - Paul: fruitful as long as I live! (Phil. 1:19-22)
 - if we are diligent, we will not be unfruitful (2 Pt. 1:5-8)
 - This is what we have been created for in Christ (Eph. 2:10)
 - Zealous of good works (Titus 2:14; 3:1,8)
- C. Increasing in the knowledge of God (Col. 1:10)
 - repeated from (**Col. 1:9**), this is important, foundational!
 - a lifelong pursuit of growing in knowledge of God's word!
 - that we might be those who are worthy of the Lord
 - a safeguard from error (2 Pt. 3:17-18)
 - diligent effort, let word dwell richly (2 Tim. 2:15; Col. 3:16)
- D. Strengthened with all might (Col. 1:11)
 - strengthened by the power of God, NOT our own power
 - Can do things through Christ not possible alone (Phil. 4:13)
 - his prayer for the Ephesians (Eph. 3:14-21)
 - The whole armor of God (Eph. 6:10-17)
 - The result of strength: Patience, longsuffering, Joy (c.f. Fruit of the Spirit – Gal. 5:22-23)
- E. Giving thanks to the Father (Col. 1:12-14)
 - giving thanks always for all things (Eph. 5:20)
 - should be part of constant prayers to God (1 Thess. 5:16-18)
 - give thanks for:
 - Qualified us for our inheritance (Col. 1:12b; 1 Pt. 1:3-5)

- Delivered us from the power of darkness (Col. 1:13a; Eph. 2:1-5)

- Conveyed (translated) us into the kingdom of His Son (Col. 1:13b-14)
